What is BikeSafe?

BikeSafe is a national police-run motorcycle scheme that operates here in North Yorkshire to help you become an even better rider. During a BikeSafe session, you'll focus on real-life riding skills, get great hints and tips from highly trained riders and then take to the road for a fun, observed ride to pull it all together.

"Lifetime skills helping you to be the best rider you can be"

What does it cover?

BikeSafe courses cover a range of topics to help you focus on real-life skills that you will use on the road.

These include:

- Cornering
- Positioning
- Overtaking
- Observation
- Systematic methods
- Braking
- Hazard perception
- Use of gears

The course will include an on-the-road observed ride with a highly qualified police motorcyclist or approved BikeSafe observer. It's fun and the benefits could last a lifetime.

What does it give you?

- An insight into more skilled riding techniques
- Feedback following an observed ride
- A certificate of completion

And importantly – it helps identify your strengths and weaknesses in preparation for training by recognised accredited providers.

What do you need to know?

Where are sessions held?

How long does the workshop last?

BikeSafe starts at 8.45am and finishes around 4.00pm

What does it cost?

The full day costs £84 per person.

Is it run for profit?

No. The objective is to increase rider skills and reduce casualties.

How long does the observed ride last?

This varies, but it will usually be over an hour.
